(1) **Down L.L.Bean Mountain Laurel Down Jacket** Eco-nomic stimulus in the form of a 650-fill down jacket with a soft, shaggy hood and a feminine cut. \$119; llbean.com

(2) **Resort Patagonia Sidewall Jacket** Roomier than most resortwear, this waterproof jacket has a brushed-polyester lining, fuzzy collar, and removable hood. \$300; patagonia.com

(3) **Backcountry/FlyLow Dolce Vita Jacket** FlyLow broke into girls' gear with a waterproof-breathable and lightly lined soft shell that's warm enough for skiing but, thanks to ample pit zips, great for touring as well. \$250; flylowgear.com

(4) **High Tech Rossignol Hit II Jacket** They make this classy jacket expensive, but the redesigned, built-in heating panels definitely work. On the high setting, you can get up to six 20-minute blasts of heat in the torso, sleeves, and collar. \$800; rossignol.com

(5) **Lightweight Shell Eddie Bauer First Ascent Mountain Guide Jacket** We were skeptical, but Eddie Bauer's new technical apparel is legit. This water-resistant, quick-drying shell is lightweight but still roomy enough to layer underneath. \$229; firstascent.com

(6) **Casual Nau Down Shirt** This 850-fill piece is the ultimate base layer (yes, it's svelte enough to wear under a shell), but its chic western flair looks even better after you peel off the layers for après-ski. \$195; nau.com
